Then Moses replied, "If you aren't going with us, please don't make us leave this place…" Exodus 33:15

Where will you go? As graduation looms closer, it becomes a constant question. If your family is still serving in the Military, it gets trickier to think about moving for work or school.

Moses and the Israelites celebrated leaving slavery in Egypt to go to the land God had promised them—a safe place with plenty of food where they could own their own homes and live free.

But the Israelites disobeyed God on the way. They committed the ultimate betrayal of worshipping another god (a golden statue of a calf). God told Moses to go on without him. But even with amazing promises of good land, Moses didn't want to go without God. He reminded God they were his people and that he had called Moses his friend.


God didn't need the reminder, but perhaps Moses did. And the people needed to decide they wanted God more than anything else.

When it's finally your turn to pick where you will live and what you do, maybe you'll start planning to live out your biggest dreams. Or maybe you'll have no idea what's ahead. You're going to have to decide for yourself which is better: your idea of what's great, or God himself. Wherever the road leads you, being without God can turn even your biggest dreams into dead ends. But being with him can make the worst situations turn into the best experiences. The Great Comeback

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God had already planned and decided that Jesus would be handed over to you. So you took him and had evil men put him to death on a cross. But God set him free from death and raised him to life. Death could not hold him in its power. Acts 2:23–24

No one could come back from this. The night before Jesus died, he was arrested and sent to various trials. One of his closest friends, Peter, followed along. But instead of defending Jesus, he denied he even knew him—three times. Peter betrayed not only his best friend, but God.

Yet when Jesus rose from the dead, he brought Peter back as his follower. He forgave him and allowed him to be the first public speaker to tell of his death and resurrection.

And when Peter spoke, he pointed out that God had this plan all along. Before the first humans sinned, God knew he would send his Son to bring salvation. Jesus would be the perfect sacrifice to take the punishment of death, which we all deserved. But death was not his end; he would be raised to life and he would have victory over all evil.

You may feel like there's no coming back from what you have done. You may have deeply hurt the people closest to you. Maybe you refused God himself. Peter's life shows us that God can wipe the slate clean for you. God isn't surprised or overwhelmed by your actions, and he is willing to save you. He can forgive you, restore your relationship with him, and help you to be faithful to him.

You just have to be willing. You have to accept God's plan, ask for his forgiveness, and believe he will forgive you.







Hatred. Anger. Violence. Nicky Cruz knew nothing else in his life. During his childhood in Puerto Rico, his parents practiced witchcraft and beat him. When he moved to New York City, he started a life on the streets as a teenager and soon became the leader of a vicious gang called the Mau Maus.

Fear and darkness surrounded his life and heart. It seemed there was no hope for him to leave gang life, to change what he had become.

Then a pastor started coming around, telling Nicky he could find forgiveness and a new life in Jesus. Nicky's initial reaction was to beat up the man. But the pastor was relentless in his pursuit, telling him Jesus loved him. Finally, Nicky stopped running. He repented—he turned away from his sins. And Jesus changed him!


Since then, Nicky has dedicated his life to ministry to inner-city people, telling them about Jesus, who can change the way they think and transform their hearts and minds. Through Cruz's speaking and a movie about his life called "The Cross and the Switchblade," he has reached millions of people with the Gospel of Christ.

Christ never sinned! But God treated him as a sinner, so Christ could make us acceptable to God. 2 Corinthians 5:21

What do we do with evil? What is the solution to obvious, hateful, cruel sin? When we can answer that, there is hope for the world.

Without that answer, we are doomed. Even within ourselves we see the tendency to sin—to lash out, to say careless and cruel things, to only take care of ourselves. No one is perfect, and so we have no way to conquer sin.





A prostitute from an enemy country. Not the best credentials for starting a new life. But Rahab made a critical decision to jump on God's side, and it saved her.

It all happened when God was bringing his people into a land where they could live and worship him in peace. Together they would clear out their enemies as they conquered section by section. When they neared the city of Jericho, God's appointed leader, Joshua, sent spies to explore the place that God had said was so filled with sin it had to be completely destroyed.

But the spies were noticed, and the authorities came looking for them. They ducked into Rahab the harlot's home, forcing her hand. She knew an all-powerful God was with the invaders, so she risked everything and chose to trust him. She hid them, lied to her authorities, and helped them escape. Because of this, they promised she and her family would be saved.


Rahab's actions and her faith in a God she didn't know changed the course of her life. She and her family became God-followers, and she became part of the lineage of Jesus.

Are you embarrassed by your past or proud of it? Do you just wish you could be free of yesterday so you could live boldly today?

Paul thought he was doing everything right. He was a religious man, zealous for God. He went to the right school, was respected as a leader in the Jewish church, and followed all the rules. He even persecuted those he thought were going against God!

But then, he met Jesus. Paul realized Jesus held a different standard. Everything he had done amounted to nothing in God's eyes; he was still hopelessly unholy. His only chance was to accept Jesus's death on the cross as the perfect sacrifice for sin and be forgiven by Jesus. Jesus was the only way for Paul to be made perfect before God.

You might think, "But Paul did so much good in his life . . . doesn't that count for something?"








That was Betty Olsen's problem for much of her youth. Life had thrown her some challenges including her mother dying, leaving her angry and resentful. She needed a total change to stop the broken record of lashing out; she needed to find a new song to sing.

A pastor helped her begin to work through her issues. Through hours of prayer and Bible reading, Betty began to unpack that hurt and let go of what she felt was her right to be angry. She gave the Lord control, and he changed her!


Betty was sent to work at a Vietnamese hospital during the war. Sadly, she was captured by the enemy's army. While suffering brutal treatment, she was still kind to her captors. Other missionaries credited her courage and strength as the sole reason they were kept alive.

Like Betty, when you give God control of your life, he can change the ugly, angry, sinful part of you. In this week's verse, David sang a literal song to God. We're not sure if Betty sang out loud to God, but her new song shone through her Christ-like attitude. God can give you a new song, too. Just ask him!

No one takes my life from me. I give it up willingly! I have the power to give it up and the power to receive it back again, just as my Father commanded me to do. John 10:18

A father sacrifices his perfect son so that his other kids don't have to suffer the punishment for what they did wrong? That might seem messed up.

But that's not the full story.

Jesus tried several times to explain to his disciples what would soon happen to him. In John 10, he compares himself to a good shepherd who loves and cares for the sheep.


Jesus was not just a good man who was willing to do the right thing for the sake of others. No, Jesus and God are one—the same person. And Jesus volunteered. He decided to die for us even before he was sent to Earth.


Jesus chose to take on all the punishment for our thoughtless and rebellious sin. He put the guilt, the shame, the ugliness on himself. He died the awful death we deserved.

Why would he do such a thing? Because of a love for us that is so great, so deep, so full, so perfect. So, when we think of his death on the cross, remember it's not just a death or a tragic loss. Rather, we're watching God, as a human being, step forward to sacrifice himself and then have the power to come back from the grave. And that makes all the difference.






Concerned with Repentance

In that city of Nineveh there are more than 120,000 people who cannot tell right from wrong, and many cattle are also there. Don't you think I should be concerned about that big city? Jonah 4:11

When pop culture portrays God, we often see two stereotypes: a harsh, angry God that can never be satisfied, or a soft, loving one who forgives everything.

Who is the real God?

In the book of Jonah, we get a clearer picture. God speaks to Jonah, a prophet in Israel living among God's chosen people, and tells him to give the people of Nineveh a message. But Jonah disobeyed. The problem in Jonah's eyes was that they were Israel's enemies—wicked people whom Jonah would rather see punished for their many sins.

Jonah tries to run away from the task, but God convinces him to do it. (Think boat in a big storm, Jonah tossed overboard, swallowed by a huge fish.) Jonah obediently preaches about God's coming wrath. The people of Nineveh repent and God forgives. But then, rather than rejoicing over God's grace, Jonah gets angry.

We're left with God's haunting question to Jonah, "Don't you think I should be concerned about them?" It hangs there still for us to consider.

So, we see here a very involved God: one who sees the sins of many, and the heart of one. We see a just God who will not let evil continue forever. He wants everyone to repent. And we see a compassionate God who sends a storm, a big fish, and a preacher to save a city and to pursue the stubborn, unrepentant heart.

Forgiveness in a Cancel Culture

"But no one who drinks the water I give will ever be thirsty again. The water I give will become in that person a flowing fountain that gives eternal life." John 4:14

She was cut off. Alone. She'd only go out to the community water well when no one else would be there. She had made bad choices in her life, and they shunned her for it.

Been there? Have you been or felt "cancelled" by people because of something you did? We all need mercy sometimes. Gut-wrenching forgiveness. And we often forget others need it, too.

In this Bible story, Jesus chose the right time to be at the well so he could talk to this woman. She started arguing with him immediately, wondering why he would even bother. But he patiently broke down all her walls. And he offered her a new life.

In this new life, he could forgive her. His granting of grace could make her innocent before God so she could live eternally with him. It could also give her life back in the here and now. Encountering Jesus and his love could free her from isolation and release her from the grip of sin. She could have hope for a better future—eternal life with God. And she shared the chance for a new life with others. Many of the people who heard her testimony believed in Jesus.

That's the forgiveness we desperately need. People might cancel us. But Jesus offers life to all who truly repent. He can give eternal life, and he can turn things around for us today.





"This punishment is too hard!" Cain said. "You're making me leave my home and live far from you. I will have to wander about without a home, and just anyone could kill me.""No!" the Lord answered. "Anyone who kills you will be punished seven times worse than I am punishing you." So the Lord put a mark on Cain to warn everyone not to kill him. Genesis 4:13–15

Jealousy, anger, rage, murder—it all started in the very first generation, brother on brother, and continues today. We get angry. We fight. We kill. And the world cries for justice.


God will answer. He will not let evil go unpunished. Someday, his justice will right all wrongs. And yet, he is also merciful. We know this because of the story of the first murder. Adam and Eve's son, Cain, got mad at his brother, Abel, and killed him. When God spoke with him, Cain remained unrepentant. So why are we studying Cain this week? Seems like he's not a brave warrior that we should emulate. In God's Word, there are some stories that teach us what to do... and some that teach us what *not* to do.

God punished Cain by sending him away from his homeland. Cain felt this punishment was too hard. The murderer feared someone would murder him. So even in bringing justice, God showed mercy. He placed a mark on Cain so no one would kill him.

With so much evil in this world, it can seem hopeless, unless we look to the God who made us. We must allow him to take revenge, trust him to carry out justice one day, and thank him for his compassion in saving us from the punishment we deserve. Then we find hope.

WEEK THIRTY-EIGH1

Christ died once for our sins. An innocent person died for those who are guilty. Christ did this to bring you to God, when his body was put to death and his spirit was made alive. 1 Peter 3:18

As a Military kid, it's easy to feel kind of ... homeless. When you move a lot, you may not really connect to any one place. You may miss things from places you've lived before. So, feeling at home might be less about being somewhere, and more about being with people who love and understand you.

Our souls find their home in God. When we wander away from God through rebellion or even apathy, our souls are lost and unsettled, whether we feel it or not. We were made to be at peace with God, loving him and being loved by him.


Peter went on to write letters to God's people, including this week's reading, showing us how Jesus made a way for our souls to come home so we can be with God eternally.






The angel appeared and spoke to Gideon, "The LORD is helping you, and you are a strong warrior." Judges 6:12

We tend to think heroes are always brave or that somehow they were born with uncommon strength. And we feel like we are not equipped with that strength.

Gideon knew he was no hero. He was a coward in a weak country. He was trying to hide his food supplies from the enemies who were obliterating his country when an angel came to him. "The Lord is helping you, and you are a strong warrior," the angel said. Gideon's first reaction was to argue about both parts of the statement. He did not think the Lord was with him or his people. And he did not see himself as a mighty warrior.
