Seasons Change but God Remains

Crisp air, crunchy leaves, pumpkin spice everything. Summer is fading, which signals we're entering the new season of fall. This is a change we expect, because it happens every year.

Some changes are like this expected, refreshing, and welcomed. While other changes are frustrating, hard, and unexpected—like a last-minute PCS to a less than desirable location.

But God's Word says everything has a time, a season, a beginning, and an end. So, we can be assured that, just like the season changes from summer to fall, the circumstances that surround our lives will also change. Close friends may come and go; we may have to change homes and churches; we may feel completely alone after a season in which we felt surrounded by the joy of close community.

While change is inevitable, God never changes; he never leaves or abandons, his love remains, and he will complete the good work he has started in our hearts and spirits.

So, what is our job in this everchanging life? God's Word tells us to worship him only, and to enjoy the many blessings he gives us, even when they are a bit more temporary than what we thought or expected. When he is the focus, the sting of hard changes will feel a bit more manageable

Seasons change, but God remains. So, during this fall season, embrace the hard changes, while expecting the upcoming good changes. Worship him in all seasons, and trust that his timing is always for our good.
