The cows went straight up the road toward Beth-Shemesh, mooing as they went. The Philistine rulers followed them until they got close to Beth-Shemesh.

1 Samuel 6:12

The nation of Israel was falling apart. The priests were corrupt. Their leader was old and wouldn't hold them to God's standards. They lost a battle against the Philistines. So, they decided to bring out the Ark of the Covenant for the next battle. This golden box symbolized God's presence and would certainly bring them victory. But, they were defeated again. The corrupt priests and their weak leader were killed, and worse, the enemy captured the ark.

The Philistines brought the ark into the temple of their god Dagon and set it in front of the statue. That night, the idol fell over. They propped it up and tried again. But the next night it fell again ... and broke.


This put the fear of God in them and they started moving the ark from town to town. Everywhere it went, people got tumors and died. Finally, the Philistines decided to "see" if the ark should go home. They devised a plan to put it on a cart and hitch it to cows who had never pulled before and who had babies they most certainly would want to go towards. They put some gifts in the cart too—gold tumors and rats.

When they let them go, the cows headed straight up the road to Israel. God brought the ark back again and everyone received the message: God was more powerful and not someone they could manipulate.

Miracles So, will God bless your plans? The better question might be, are you following His? God doesn't exist to serve our goals—we're here to follow His will, trust His power, and live His way.

God cannot be manipulated. If we want his blessing, we must submit our plans and ways to him.

# What If I'm Trying My Hardest but Getting Nowhere?



All of them saw him and were terrified. But at this same time he said, "Don't worry! I am Jesus. Don't be afraid." He then got into the boat with them, and the wind died down. The disciples were completely confused.

Mark 6:50–51

When you've been rowing for hours and getting nowhere ... when the headwinds are pushing against you ... what can you do?

The men were exhausted. The day just wouldn't end. Jesus and his disciples had tried to get away by boat to a wilderness area. But the crowds chased them down there too, so Jesus healed and taught them. When the disciples told him to send them away—for food—he fed them instead.

As it was getting dark, Jesus sent his men back without him. They took the boat across the lake while Jesus went up a mountain to pray. But they were rowing against a strong wind, and by the middle of the night they were still in the middle of the lake, still struggling. That's when Jesus saw them. All their strength and skill wasn't enough.

Not long before dawn, the disciples saw Jesus . . . walking past them . . . on the water. They thought he was a ghost! That was easier to believe than what they were actually witnessing. But when they cried out, he told them to not be afraid. He identified himself the same way God did—with the words, "I Am."


Jesus stepped into the boat with them. And the wind stopped. Once again, they saw him control nature. Once again, they were confronted with who he was.

When your strength runs out and the fear overwhelms you, Jesus steps in—bringing peace, power, and the reminder that you're never alone.






# What Difference Can One Person Make Against Evil?



When Goliath started forward, David ran toward him. He put a rock in his sling and swung the sling around by its straps. When he let go of one strap, the rock flew out and hit Goliath on the forehead. It cracked his skull, and he fell facedown on the ground.

1 Samuel 17:48-49

It's too hard. Hundreds of Israelite soldiers sized up their adversary and came to that conclusion. Even the Israelite king, a head taller than the rest and a battle-hardened warrior, was looking up in fear at this nine-foot-nine-inch foul giant, the champion of the enemy army.

So, the army who said they believed in the living God trembled in fear every time this giant Goliath stepped out to mock them and their God. For 40 days they were at a stand-off, one army on one hill, one on another, with Goliath looking for an opponent in the valley below.

It took an outsider to see the absurdity. A boy, probably a teenager, was sent to bring supplies to his brothers in the Israelite army. He arrived to witness the cursing giant spew his daily challenge, and he was shocked to see him get away with it.


Where others saw only the bully, David knew the Almighty God. David wanted to defend God's honor, and he was confident in the Lord's power. So he picked up five stones and his sling and walked into that valley.

Goliath laughed at him. But David threw one stone, hit him in the forehead, knocked him out cold, and cut off his head. David said, "I come in the name of the LORD All-Powerful." And before God, giants fall. When just one person trusts in the power of God, he can stand where others run—and bring down giants.

'But we don't want to cause trouble. So go cast a line into the lake and pull out the first fish you hook. Open its mouth, and you will find a coin. Use it to pay your taxes and mine."

Matthew 17:27

You know how things are extra funny when you are supposed to be serious? Peter had one of those days with Jesus. It all started when the tax collectors came for the tax used to maintain the temple. They cornered Peter and questioned if Jesus was going to pay—again looking for ways to make trouble with Jesus. Peter quickly assured them they would get the money. Then he headed home.

He was probably worrying a bit how they could get the coin, though, since they weren't working for pay while Jesus was teaching. He stepped into his house, and before he could say anything, Jesus met him with the question: "Does a king's family have to pay taxes?" "Well, no," Peter replied. "That would be weird. The people pay taxes to the king."


"Well, we don't have to pay either," Jesus said. The point was, they are part of God's royal family and thus exempt from the tax. Mind-blowing concept. "But," Jesus continued, "we don't want to make trouble, so let's pay it."

Then came the funny part. Jesus sent Peter (a professional fisherman with boats and nets) and told him to use a single hook and catch the first fish that bit. When Peter opened up the fish's mouth, there would be a coin in it—the exact amount they needed. While most people were preoccupied about law and money, God makes a coin pop up out of nowhere. He sees the whole picture, cares about the details, and sometimes meets your needs in ways so unexpected, all you can do is laugh and trust him more.






#### Will God Take Care of Me?



Ravens brought him bread and meat twice a day, and he drank water from the creek. 1 Kings 17:6

The nation was falling into chaos and wickedness. Ahab, the new king, was rebelling against the Lord. He had married a princess from another country and built a temple for her god Baal, a regional fertility god whose worship often included child sacrifice. His queen, Jezebel, later began to massacre the priests of God. It was a bad time for those who loved God.

So, God deployed his prophet Elijah. He confronted Ahab and told him there would be no dew or rain until God allowed it—in a few years. This was a direct assault on Baal, who was known as the god of storms. And it was a threat to the people's food supply because crops would die.

Since that didn't win friends and influence people, Elijah had to go into witness protection. God told him where to hide. He sent him to a ravine in the wilderness where he could drink from the stream. Then, every morning and night, bread and meat were delivered to Elijah by winged carrier service . . . by ravens

In the face of great danger, Elijah obeyed God and God protected him in mindblowing ways.

The God who sent ravens with dinner is the same God who sees you, knows your needs, and never forgets His own.

Miracles

God works out every detail to care for our needs.

Each generation has its own battle against wickedness, and every follower of God will need to serve where and when God sends them. The way to be strong like Elijah is to stay close to the Lord. Spiritual food comes from God, so you need to pay attention to your supply chain. To which spiritual exercises will you commit? Make a battle plan!

# Why Is Life So Hard for Some People?



After Jesus said this, he spit on the ground. He made some mud and smeared it on the man's eyes. Then he said, "Go wash off the mud in Siloam Pool." The man went and washed in Siloam, which means "One Who Is Sent." When he had washed off the mud, he could see.

John 9:6–7

Sometimes it doesn't matter what you do—people are against you anyway. Even when Jesus did amazing miracles that changed lives for good, some people refused to believe in him.

For example, one time Jesus met a man who had been born blind. His disciples wanted to know: Did he do something wrong, or did his parents? No, Jesus said, this happened to show God's mysterious work.

So Jesus spit in some dirt, formed mud, and put it on the man's eyes. Then, he told him to go wash it off in the pool called Siloam, which means "Sent" (a little symbolism intended there). God the Creator made man out of the dirt, and now here was the Son of God, re-creating a man's eyes. He was bringing light into his darkness. When the man washed off the mud, he could see!

But, some of the religious leaders refused to see the light. They called the man a liar and Jesus a hoax. But the formerly blind man simply kept asking, how is it that I can now see? So they threw him out, calling him a hopeless sinner.

Later, Jesus came to him and told him who he was. The man said he believed Jesus was Lord, and he worshiped him. Jesus told the people who would not believe that they were the blind ones, and the guilty ones. Sometimes it's through the hardest struggles that God shows up the clearest and those who hold on to faith in the dark are the ones who truly learn to see.






#### What If I Doubt God Will Come Through?



The LORD immediately sent fire, and it burned up the sacrifice, the wood, and the stones. It scorched the ground everywhere around the altar and dried up every drop of water in the ditch.

1 Kings 18:38

If anyone ever had the world against him, it was Elijah. The nation of Israel had turned in part to the worship of a false god named Baal. The evil queen Jezebel surrounded herself with hundreds of prophets, and had the prophets of God hunted down and slaughtered. There was a bounty on Elijah's head too.

So, it shocked the country when he stepped out of hiding to publicly challenge Jezebel's prophets. On Mount Carmel, each side would build an altar and slaughter a bull. The God who responded with fire would be the one Israel would worship.

When the 450 prophets of Baal had arranged their altar, they prayed. After no response came, they prayed harder, louder, more passionately. They even began to cut themselves to stir up their storm god to give them a spark. Still nothing. Elijah made fun of them—maybe Baal was relieving himself.

Finally, Elijah stepped up, his very life on the line. He built the altar, set the wood, laid down the sacrificial bull. Then, he had people pour water over it. Buckets came until everything was soaked and a moat of water puddled around it. The message was clear: burning this would take an act of God. Elijah calmly prayed. After a few sentences, God sent a fireball so hot it burned even the stones. The people responded the only way they could, proclaiming their allegiance to God and killing the false prophets.

Miracles When doubt creeps in, step forward in faith, pray honestly, and let God show that He's still the One who answers with fire.

It's not always so dramatic, but God will reveal himself to people who ask him.

Many people have doubts at times, but God promises to be found by people who look for him. How have you seen God work? Ask some friends, too, and make a list!

So, when Jesus walked past, they kept their distance, but began to shout, asking him for mercy.

Jesus sent them to see the priests, who had the responsibility to inspect their skin so they could re-enter society. It took faith to start hobbling that way before anything happened, but as they did, new health coursed through their veins. Skin re-grew.

But, only one thought to run back and thank Jesus. He fell on his face in front of Jesus, his praise to God and his thanks to Jesus just as loud as his shouts for mercy had been.

Jesus wondered how only one man came back to say thank you. He sent the worshipper on his way, healed in body and soul.

If you want to show love to Jesus, start by remembering what He's done—and never stop running back to thank Him with your whole heart.






Soon the LORD'S angel woke him again and said, "Get up and eat, or else you'll get too tired to travel."

1 Kings 19:7

Great highs, great lows. Elijah was going through it all! But now he was done, physically, mentally, and emotionally.

He wound up lying in the dust—under a bush, in the middle of nowhere—praying God would take his life. Never mind that God had just defeated Baal through him, or that he had slaughtered 450 wicked prophets of Baal, or that he had prayed for rain and God answered, or that he had run for miles ahead of the king's chariot in that rainstorm.

All Elijah could focus on was the wicked queen's threat to his life. So he ran away. Fled the country. And now he told God he was done. He wanted to die. He fell asleep with his face in the dirt.

But an angel woke him up and fed him. He ate and slept again. The angel woke him again with more food, then sent him on his way. Elijah walked for 40 more days to the mountain where Moses had met God.

On the mountain, Elijah hid in a crevice. A windstorm came—blowing rocks around. An earthquake shook the land. A fire swept through. Still, Elijah waited for God

Then came a whisper. The God who is always close listened to Elijah's worries. He offered encouragement, reminding Elijah of his power and explaining some of his plan. Then he sent Elijah out again with new jobs to accomplish. You can be real with God—he's not afraid of your honesty, and he'll meet you in your mess with love and strength.

God understands our weaknesses. He hears our concerns. He takes care of our needs.

#### **Does God Control Death?**



The man who had been dead came out. His hands and feet were wrapped with strips of burial cloth, and a cloth covered his face. Jesus hen told the people, "Untie him and let him go."

John 11:44

It's not the way it's supposed to be. People were created for life, for love, for relationship. Death is separation. And death is hopeless . . . unless you know Jesus.

Jesus's friends Mary and Martha experienced that. Their brother, Jesus's friend Lazarus, had died. They were four days into the mourning when Jesus finally arrived, though they had sent for him much earlier, while Lazarus was just sick. Jesus found a scene of sorrow, confusion, even hurt. "If only you had come earlier," the sisters told him, "he wouldn't have died." Now they would never again talk with him; never laugh or hug or eat with him.


Jesus joined in their tears. Even though he knew what he was about to do, he cried for the loss of his friend, and was angry at the enemy that death is, at the sin that leads to illness, heartache, death itself.

Then, he stepped to the tomb. He called Lazarus's name, and the dead man, wrapped up like a mummy, got up and walked out. Everything changed. Crying to laughter. Disappointment to amazement. A decaying corpse to a live man. Hopelessness turned to triumph. They knew Jesus could heal diseases, but they hadn't realized Jesus held power over death itself! 



Elijah and Elisha were walking along and talking, when suddenly there appeared between them a flaming chariot pulled by fiery horses. At once, a strong wind took Elijah up into heaven.

2 Kings 2:11

They both knew it was coming ... that day. The great prophet Elijah was going to be taken away to heaven. Elisha—his friend, assistant, and student—would be left to keep doing God's work.

In sorrow, anticipation, fear, awe, they started out on the journey where God was sending them. They walked for miles. Several times Elijah tried to leave Elisha behind and shield him from the coming separation. But each time Elisha insisted he would not leave him.

When they came to the Jordan River, Elijah used his cloak to part the water and they walked across on dry land. As they talked, Elijah asked if there was anything he could do for Elisha. His student asked to inherit the spirit that made the prophet able to do God's work. "If you see me being taken away," Elijah said, it would happen.


And then it happened: a chariot of fire with fiery horses came between them. And as Elisha watched, Elijah was taken up to heaven in a whirlwind!

Ever since the days when Jesus was on earth, people have doubted him. Most people liked his teaching. But even his closest disciples and friends didn't always know what to think about him. When Jesus asked Peter what he believed, he said Jesus was the Messiah, sent from God. Great! But then Jesus began talking about being killed, and Peter told him to stop. (Do you tell someone what to do if you really believe he is sent by God?) Not so great. And Jesus scolded him.

A few days later though, Jesus took Peter, James, and John up on a mountain. While they were praying, Jesus was changed in front of them. Even his clothes became astonishingly bright. Moses and Elijah appeared (the great lawgiver and the great prophet had both been gone for centuries) and were talking with Jesus. Then a cloud covered them all and a voice said, "This is my Son, and I love him. Listen to him."

The disciples were terrified. Jesus told them not to talk about this astonishing encounter yet—but after he had been killed and raised from the dead, they remembered and started to understand.

He was much more than a great teacher. They were following God's Son.







When you reach your limits and ask for help, the Lord steps in with abundance.


